**DEFINITION OF VICTIM:** "Victim" means any natural person against whom a crime has been perpetrated or attempted, unless the person is accountable for the crime or a crime arising from the same criminal conduct or plan as crime is defined under the laws of this state or of the United States, or, if such person is deceased or incapacitated, the person's spouse, parent, legal guardian, child, sibling, grandparent, grandchild, significant other, or other lawful representative.
